AM I RELATED TO JIM?

This is in response to an email asking if I was related to "Jim." At first, I didn't know who she was talking about... time to start an investigation.

The person sending the email was named Rachel Ball. I found an interesting candidate in Vera Cathcart (1915-1999), who married Heaman Roland Ball (1921-1983). Vera had a brother named James Paul... so perhaps this was "Jim." A subsequent email confirmed that I had the correct family.

But now I need to trace back and see if there was a connection.

My database stopped at James Paul and Vera's parents: James and Annie Woodward Cathcart.

Time to break down a brick wall.

Given the location of the census records I had matched with James:

- 1920: Glen Springs, Spartanburg County, SC age 25
- 1930: Cross Anchor, Spartanburg County, SC age 35

it would appear that James is a "Spartanburg Cathcart." But where does he fit in?

To further nail down James' date of birth, I found this likely World War one draft registration card (June of 1917):

The date of birth looks good, and his present address of Pauline, SC is within five miles of Glenn Springs... so that matches. James states that he had a wife and two children (Vera and Frank H) on that date, and that also matches my data fairly closely.

James gives his birth location as Pacolet, which is much further to the north... more on that later.

Next, who are James' parents? I started looking for James Cathcarts in the Glenn Springs area of SC.

The best match was:

- William Hampton & Della Cathcart
 - O Jim is six in 1900 and 15 in 1910
 - o That matches quite well

The 1910 Census has BS and WH Cathcart living right next door to each other.




Figure 2 1920 Jonesville, Union, South Carolina p. 11b

Della's name helps us link this family to my existing data, and to confirm that WH is William Hampton Cathcart.

Also, given the ages and next-door location, it would appear that BS Cathcart was James' brother. More on BS (Boyd) later.

Here's the 1900 census William and Lavanica or Lovinia




Figure 31900 Census Union Dist 78, Union SC p. 23b

Boyd Cathcart

Boyd's WW1 1917 draft card at age 39. Next of kin is listed as "Maggie Cathcart." This helped solidify his birth date.

But who was Maggie? I'll have to look into the location of Switzer in Spartanburg county.

By the 1920 census, we see Boyd is 41 and his wife Pauline is 38. The Smith step children indicate that Pauline was married before.

Then to prove that Pauline's maiden name was Lister, here's the 1910 Census showing that Pauline and Ida Lister were sisters:




Figure 6. 1910 Jonesville, Spartanburg, South Carolina p. 11b

By 1930 Pauline's two boys' last name has been changed to Cathcart.
